

Kings Creek bridge replacement works

April – July 2016

Queensland Rail is replacing the timber bridge at Kings Creek, north of Clifton, with a new concrete structure.

These works are part of Queensland Rail's commitment to replace timber bridges in order to reduce ongoing maintenance costs and provide safe, timely and adequate rail services between Toowoomba and Warwick.

What is involved?

Queensland Rail has engaged Fulton Hogan to undertake the bridge construction works.

Works will commence on site in early April with the establishment of site facilities and environmental protection measures.

The bridge replacement will occur on a scheduled rail closure weekend in early June, with piling and substructure works being undertaken in the lead up to the closure. All work activities outside of the closure weekend will be completed during the hours of 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 7am and 2pm on Saturdays.

The bridge replacement works are expected to be complete by early July.

Safety is the number one priority for Queensland Rail. To provide a safe work environment for workers and the community, access around the bridge and work sites will be restricted to authorised personnel during works.

Queensland Rail will engage with adjacent residents and property owners to clearly communicate potential construction impacts and ensure safety is maintained at all times.
